Word of the Priest

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

What did Saint Paul know about Christmas? He became a Christian only after Jesus had returned to his Father. Did he ever go to Bethlehem? Did his fellow Christians tell him about the decree of Caesar Augustus (that the whole world should be enrolled), which caused Joseph and Mary to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem?

Personally I am convinced that Paul knew the whole story because he knew well Saint Luke, his faithful companion, who wrote the gospel of the birth of Jesus. If you love someone, as Paul loved Jesus, you want to know about his origin.

There are echoes of Jesus' birth in Saint Paul's letters. He speaks of Jesus as "descended from David according to the flesh" (Rom 1,3). We know from Saint Matthew that when Joseph (who was of the house of David) agreed to take Mary and her child into his home Jesus entered the genealogy of David: Jesus became a "son of David".

"When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to ransom those under the law, so that we might receive adoption" (Gal 4,4-5). Paul does not mention the virginity of Mary, which does not matter in this context: he wants to highlight the true humanity of Jesus.

We find the same idea in the famous hymn to the Philippians: "Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance" (2,6-7).

Paul does not mention the manger, the angels, the shepherds. But he interprets the event of the Incarnation as the decisive moment of human history. God's eternal Son has come to save us by assuming a true human nature.

I am sure Saint Paul shares our joy when we sing: "Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, o Israel."
